

Silo & Corn Crib — test models

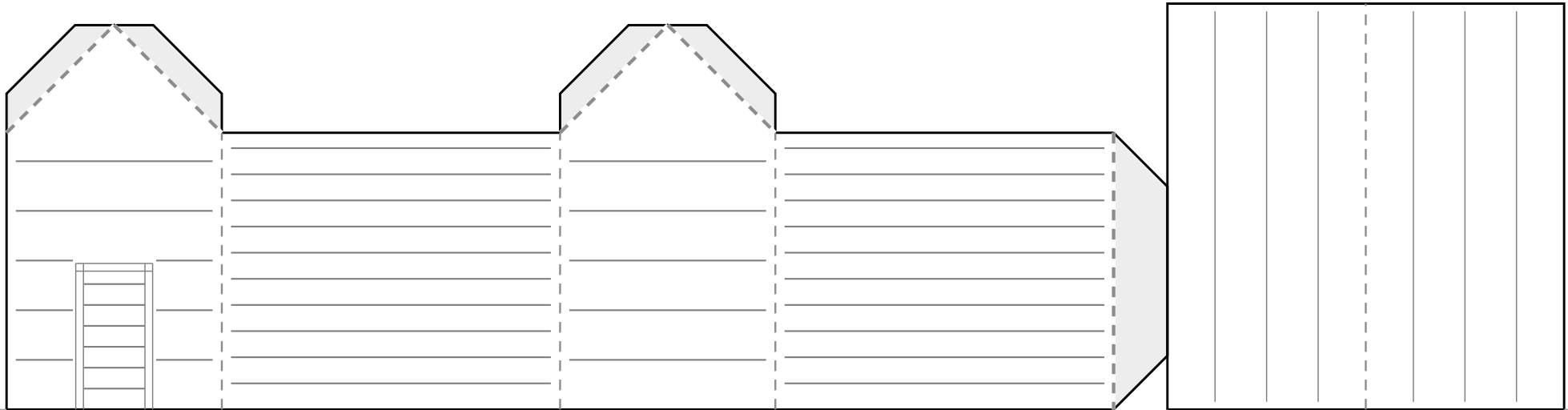

Print on cardstock at 100% scale — turn OFF 'fit to page'.

Silo about 1.5 in across and 3.7 in tall. Corn crib about 1.4 x 2.2 x 2.5 in.

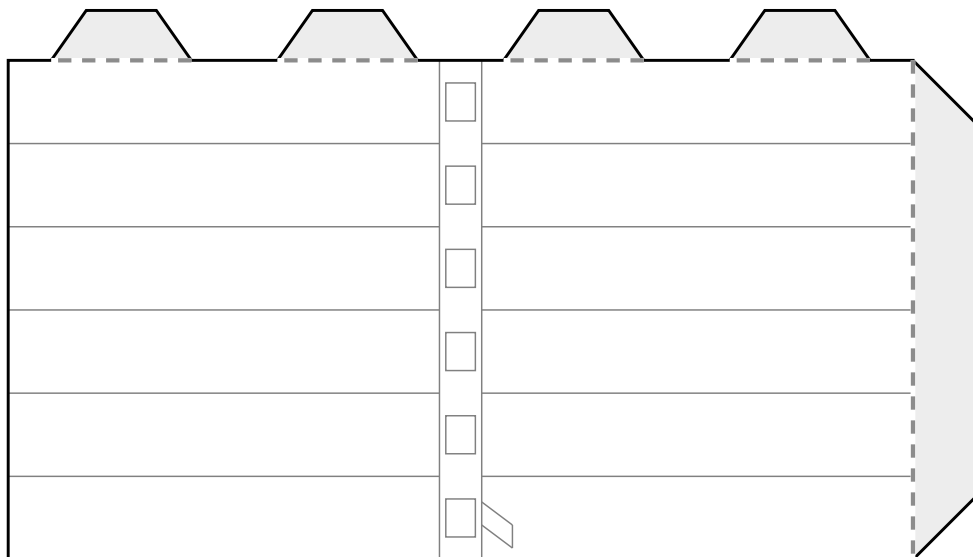
1. Colour first, while everything is flat.
2. Thick black = cut. Dashed = fold. Thin grey = where the colour changes — do not cut these.
3. Silo: curve the strip first — pull it firmly over a table edge or book spine, printed side up, or curl it round a pencil. Whichever works for you; do not just bend it. Roll into a tube, glue the tab inside, fold the top tabs in. Curve the cone the same way, glue it on last.
4. Corn crib: fold into a box, glue the end tab, fold the peak tabs in, then glue the roof onto them.

Paper cutter: grey lines running out to the paper edge are the long straight cuts. Tip: a paper clip or bobby pin holds a glued tab square while the glue dries.

CRIB ROOF — fold at the ridge



SILO ROOF — roll into a cone; it overhangs the wall like a hat

SILO — curve it over a table edge or round a pencil, roll into a tube, glue the tab inside
